














# "To Give or Not to Give?" That Is the Stoplight Ouestion

We've all been there. You're driving along, minding your own business, when the light turns red and, poof! there's someone on the corner with a cardboard sign. Suddenly you're having a full-blown moral debate with yourself before the light even turns green.

"Should I give them a dollar?, Should I look straight ahead and pretend I'm studying the clouds?, Will God grade me on this?"

Let me ease your mind: God is not standing there with a heavenly clipboard, and checking boxes. Many of us are on fixed incomes. Some of us are on *very* fixed incomes, fixed so tight they squeak. Taking care of your own needs is not selfish; it's part of wise stewardship. Even Scripture reminds us that our giving is measured by the heart, not the amount: "For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has..." (2 Corinthians 8:12).

But here's the part we often forget: Giving isn't just about money. In fact, some of the greatest gifts can't fit in a wallet: volunteer your time to help others, smile at someone who's having a rough day, bring joy to our parish community, call someone who may be lonely, share your talents (and yes, baked goods count as talents!) or offer a prayer sometimes the most powerful gift of all. If you decide to give someone a dollar, wonderful. If you don't, a quick prayer ("Lord, please help this person, and please turn the light green") all count.

So don't feel guilty. Give when you can, pray when you can't, and don't beat yourself up either way."

## **Classic Homemade Eggnog**

A rich and creamy holiday favorite. Perfect for sharing with friends or sipping by the fire.

### **Ingredients (Serves 4–6)**

- 4 large eggs, separated
- 1/3 cup sugar, plus 1 tbsp for egg whites
- 1 pint whole milk
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1½ oz bourbon *(optional)*
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz dark rum *(optional)*
- 1 tsp freshly grated nutmeg



- 1. In a mixing bowl, beat egg yolks with 1/3 cup sugar until thick and pale.
- 2. Stir in milk, cream, bourbon, rum, and nutmeg until well combined.
- 3. In a separate bowl, beat egg whites to soft peaks. Add 1 tbsp sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form.
- 4. Gently fold egg whites into the yolk mixture to create a light, frothy texture.
- 5. Chill before serving. Garnish with a sprinkle of nutmeg or cinnamon.

#### **Notes**

- For added safety, cook the eggnog base by tempering the yolks and heating the mixture until thickened.
- For a **non-alcoholic version**, simply omit the bourbon and rum.
- Serve with whipped cream, cinnamon sticks, or a dash of holiday cheer!
